From the Desk of Sheriff Jim Coats



Frequently I am approached by citizens who are curious about the operation of the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office. Often times these same people are interested

in getting involved, but they are unsure how they can do so. My response almost always includes an invitation to consider becoming a member of the Sheriff's Advisory Board.

The Sheriff's Advisory Board is a not-forprofit organization that has been in existence for almost fifty years and currently has more than 300 members. The group was formed in 1961 by Sheriff Don Genung and was originally known as the Junior Deputy League. At that time members had an interest in promoting the general welfare of our residents by providing services and instruction for the youth of Pinellas County. Their desire included providing programs and activities for children that allowed them to achieve recognition, build self confidence and responsibility as they developed into good citizens who obeyed the law and showed respect for individual rights.

Over the years membership grew and became known as the Sheriff's Advisory Board but the mission remained the same. The group has continued to consistently support the outreach of the Sheriff's Office in

promoting safety through education to the children of Pinellas County. This mission has been accomplished by supporting programs within the Youth Education and Services Division of the Sheriff's Office like the Drug Abuse Resistance Education Program, Explorer Post 900, in addition to the Florida Sheriff's Youth Ranches, the Police Athletic League and a variety of other youth organizations.

Members also enjoy a breakfast meeting held each Thursday of the month in one of four different locations across Pinellas County. As Sheriff I greet the members as they arrive by 8:00 AM after which the breakfast commences. Following a brief business meeting, a special speaker provides a presentation in his or her area of expertise as a member of the Sheriff's Office. Through this interaction with members of the Sheriff's Office, the Advisory Board has been exposed to information about crime prevention, personal safety, the new technology being used within the Sheriff's Office, new services being provided to the community, new opportunities available to citizens, and much more.

To join the Sheriff's Advisory Board you must be an adult resident of Pinellas or an adjacent county, who is of good moral character, and you must be interested in good government and advancing the purposes of the organization. Recession

ost economists define a recession as the time when business activity has reached its peak and starts to fall until the time when business activity bottoms out. When the business activity starts to rise again it's called an expansion. 

Rule by Fear

To Vaccinate Or Not To Vaccinate, Part V

ow would you like to be summoned to report at the local court house with your children and hold them still while they were forcibly vaccinated? And how would you act, if on arriving, you were herded into the courthouse with 1,600 other "non-compliant parents" by armed guards and attack dogs?

Would the "choice" of up to ten days in jail or a fifty dollar fine for every day your child was out of compliance silence any thought of protest or would you demand evidence that you were breaking the law?

Would you dare argue that your sobbing child was allergic to ethylene glycol, a vaccine ingredient, and a main ingredient in antifreeze? Would you insist that you should be permitted to call your attorney? Would you back-up your neighbor's complaint that her eldest daughter's autism was caused by her first vaccination? Relax! These are not loaded questions from the latest psychiatric parent-screen quiz but important questions you should ask of organizations such as The National Vaccine Information Center, (www.NVIC.org), 703-938-0342, Vaccine Liberation, (www.vaclib.org) and Parents Requesting Open Vaccine Education, (www.vaccineinfo.org). Dr. Sherri Tenpenny, author, lecturer and foremost authority on vaccinations says, "A growing number of parents are reconsidering and questioning, not only if vaccines are safe but if they are even necessary...The International Mortality Statistics



To reduce lawsuits, the National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act of 1986 was a landmark vaccine safety and compensation law passed by Congress after 5 years of effort by the National Vaccine Information Center, the American Academy of Pediatrics, and several vaccine manufacturers. Then on November 13 2002, the Homeland Security Bill was passed. The last four sections of the bill (1714-1717) shielded the pharmaceutical industry from lawsuits caused by FDA approved vaccines, such as mercury containing pediatric vaccines associated with the development of autism.

Seeking fewer lawsuits, Physician organizations and vaccine manufacturers asserted this would help ensure the availability of vaccines and result in reduced prices. Parents fought hard to have to have safety provisions as part of the law in an effort to prevent other children from suffering a vaccine injury or death.

In an effort to help parents make better informed decisions doctors are required to provide parents with written information prior to delivering vaccinations. The Federal Government is required to promote the improvement of existing vaccines and the development of safer vaccines; so fewer children would suffer adverse effects..

In the past 10 years autism has increased by 500% in most states, and some parents associate their child's autism with an MMR vaccine reaction or with Thimerosol, a preservative used in some vaccines for many years. Thimerosol is a mercury derivative (a known neurotoxin which kills braincells) used in killed and recombinant vaccines to prevent the growth of bacteria in multi-dose vials.

Why do we need to preserve the right to bring a lawsuit?

Vaccination is a medical procedure that carries a risk of injury or death and is performed on a healthy individual. It would be the greatest injustice to require vaccination by law, knowing that some children will be permanently braindamaged or even die as a result, and then to single out these children and their parents by taking away their right to common law protection and the right to go to court. That is hardly real justice. Indeed! Wouldn't you consider it a clear violation of Human Rights?

Why would we, the People, tolerate this violation of our rights? Or in the Maryland case - tolerate such a violation of parental consent?

Presidential Candidate Dr. Ron Paul states the reason succinctly.

"The Fear Factor. When people are fearful, they tend to be willing to surrender their rights. Thus Fear is a threat to national liberty. The psychology of fear is an essential component of those who would have us believe we must increasingly rely on the elite who manage the apparatus of central government".

"The statement, 'Those who would give up Essential Liberty to purchase a little Temporary Safety deserve neither Liberty nor Safety' has been attributed to Benjamin Franklin. It is clear people seek out safety and security when they are in a state of fear, and it is the result of this psychological state that often leads to the surrender of liberty."


The conference which pleasantly surprised me was,





"Special" Education... Education or Medication?

┪ hildren are being placed in "Special Education" under a number of different categories. The Federal regulation, that determines who gets placed in Special Education classes and what type of education they are entitled to, is the Individuals Disabilities Education Act. (IDEA).

The IDEA was originally enacted by Congress in 1975 to make sure that children with disabilities had the opportunity to receive a free appropriate public education, just like other children. When one thinks of "disabilities", one may think of a physical handicap or impairment that requires more Teacher/Student supervision in order to ensure a full education for the student. Yet, over the last few decades, "disabilities" has grown to mean a lot more than that.

The definition of a child with a disability is "with mental retardation, hearing impairments (including deafness), speech or language impairments, visual impairments (including blindness), serious emotional disturbance, orthopedic impairments, autism, traumatic brain injury, other health impairments, or specific learning disabilities". (TITLE 20, CHAPTER 33, SUBCHAPTER I, § 1400) Each of the "other health impairments or learning disabilities", carry with them, a label that is placed on the child; labels that will follow your child into adulthood.

The original intention of IDEA is to help ensure that all children have a good education. This is something that most parents would agree with. Unfortunately the categories of "other health impairments, or specific learning disabilities" have opened the door to the bogus diagnoses that are voted into existence and itemized in the "Diagnostic Statistical Manual" (psychiatry's bible).

With the categories of "other health impairments, or specific learning disabilities" we have walked ourselves into an age in which children (as young as toddlers) can be diagnosed, without medical evidence of having any disorder, and labeled and placed in the Special Education classes. Once, a bright, creative, intelligent and independent child, who perhaps is "too much of a handful" for most teachers and school counselors, is now considered "other health impaired".

Following the diagnosing and labeling of

for the prescribing of psychiatric drugs. These psychiatric drugs are at the height of controversy in the newspapers across the nation. FDA warnings placed on these drugs include side effects of hallucinations, mania, suicidal ideation, aggression, heart attacks and sudden death.

IDEA has been revised many times over the years. The most recent amendments were passed by Congress in December 2004, with final regulations published in August 2006. So, in some senses, the law is very new, even as it has a long, detailed, and powerful history.

The changes that were made in 2004, address the issue of Parental Consent. For any parent who has gotten a "permission slip" from their child, you will understand that these permission slips or parental consent forms, are typically given to you by your child, for a field trip, a special event at school, or for disciplinary reasons, and is something you usually get when you are running around at home, trying to make dinner, get the kids to school, get yourself to work, etc. Permission slips or parental consent forms are something that should be read, thoroughly, and at times, with a magnifying glass. Do not skip through these forms, as often they are a parental consent form for an "intervention program", mental health questionnaire, or for special education. You, as a parent, need to be fully informed about your child's education. Your basic human right of being fully informed is vital to the future of your child's education, their future jobs and their overall well-being. Times have changed, and mental health is a factor in public education.

"There has been no objective criteria established for any disorder listed in the Diagnostic Statistical Manual IV and the National Institute of Mental Health Consensus Conference on ADHD acknowledged that as of yet there is no diagnostic test that is objective and the conception of this being a neurological entity has not been delineated. However, 6,000,000 American children have received this diagnosis and are given Schedule II amphetamine drugs to 'treat' this highly subjective 'disorder'. There has been the argument that providing parental informed consent will lead to children not being properly 'diagnosed.' We should then ask- who is then to assume control

the child, is the referral to a psychiatrist to usurp the parental role? In addition, it has often been psychiatric intervention which has actually led to more harm than good.

> All psychiatric drugs have serious side effects, and we are now finding that stimulants can lead to psychosis and mania and anti-depressants now carry black box warnings about the potential for suicidal thought. By informed consent, parents can know the necessary information to make an appropriate choice about their children's well being." Dan Edmunds, D.ED, Psychologist

> If a parent gets a parental consent form, regarding special education, they need to know, per the 2004 changes, that the school needs to make "reasonable" efforts to obtain the parents consent.


> Regarding parental consent for reevaluations (translated, this means if the school wants to re-evaluate your child for Special Education): "if a parent refuses to consent to a re-evaluation, the public agency may, but is not required to, pursue the re-evaluation by using the consent override procedures". This emphasizes the reasons why it is important for the parents to take an active role in their child's education. Stay involved, stay in touch with the teachers and counselors and see how your child is progressing. This will prevent any type of override of your own intentions for your child's education.

Also, that in order for a school "to meet the reasonable efforts requirement to obtain informed parental consent for an initial evaluation, initial services, or a re-evaluation, a public agency must document its attempts to obtain parental consent..."

The schools have the open door to watch out for disciplinary problems on campus, tardiness, skipped classes, or generally, "insufficient" progress by the student. You, as the parent, can watch over your child's progress and understand what the school is looking at. For instance, per the 2004 changes in IDEA "...a child has a specific learning disability if the child does not achieve adequately for the child's age or to meet State-approved grade-level standards in one or more of eight areas (e.g., oral expression, basic reading skill, etc.)"

over the lives of children? Who intends "From a psychiatric standpoint this labeling

may be permanent and may adversely affect the child's subsequent academic and social progress. For instance, access to psychiatric diagnoses by college admission departments may result in individuals being rejected for college admission on



Who is there to protect the information obtained in psychiatric tests, and guarantee confidentiality? Such confidentiality will be very difficult to maintain.

Permanent stigmatization of a child with a psychiatric diagnosis may occur. This label will follow the child throughout his life. Even if the problem is addressed, treated and cured (for example, through physical and medical testing that reveals a bonafide medical condition), the stigma of the diagnosis is likely to remain indefinitely. Such is the case throughout the world of medicine with diagnoses such as manic depressive disorder, diabetes mellitus, coronary artery disease, and hypertension."

Florida schools must be required to comply with IDEA and fully inform parents of all of the consequences, risks and alternatives to exceptional student evaluation for emotional, behavioral and learning disabilities and "other impairments", including the predictable outcome of that evaluation - psychotropic medication.

"Without question the testing will lead to a recommendation or insistence on drug therapy for many children. This would be a dangerous situation. Therefore there is no control whatsoever on the use of drugs for emotional or psychiatric abnormalities. It is well known that children initiated on psychiatric medications are maintained on those medications indefinitely, and children may be subject to such drug use, possibly compelled to such drug use, in adult life."
